EVIDENCE, INFERENCE, & IMPACT ARE FOUNDATIONAL

Achievement Teams are grounded in three factors: they use real student evidence, the process helps teachers make accurate, data-based inferences about students, and the instructional strategies used are the ones that research shows have the most impact on student learning.

TEACHER CLARITY IS VITAL FOR STUDENT SUCCESS

Our students cannot be successful if we don't clearly communicate what is expected of them and what success looks like.





DATA WILL INFORM INSTRUCTIONAL DECISIONS

In learner-centered classrooms, teachers use assessment data to understand impact and guide decisions around the instructional practices that will work best for the students in that particular classroom.

COLLABORATION CANNOT OCCUR WITHOUT LEADERSHIP

An active and present instructional leader works right alongside the teacher teams to focus on students achievement. Effective leaders monitor collaborative time, visit classrooms, and participate in learning.





EFFECTIVE TEAMS ARE GROUNDED IN RELATIONAL TRUST & ACCOUNTABILITY

When team members build relational trust, true collaboration can happen under the most positive conditions; conditions where mistakes are ok and where learning from others is essential.

COLLECTIVE EFFICACY IS ESSENTIAL FOR SUCCESS

The belief that what the group is doing can make a difference and the belief that the work they are doing collaboratively is worth the time and effort. This is collective efficacy.
